
National News

Ham Aid Kits Positioned to Deploy as Typhoon Yutu Ravages Central Pacific Islands (from arrl)

In a little more than one day, the cyclone that became Super Typhoon Yutu grew from tropical storm to a

Category 5 monster. Yutu is said to be the strongest storm on record to hit the Northern Mariana Islands, home to about 55,000 people. The storm made landfall on Wednesday evening (October 24), destroying homes, wreaking severe wind and storm-surge damage and flooding, and knocking out water, power, and telecommunications on the islands. Utilities could remain down for an extended period.

Before reaching the islands, Yutu's sustained winds were reported to be 175 MPH. The storm is now tracking northwest toward the Philippines and Taiwan.



ARRL Emergency Preparedness Manager Mike Corey, KI1U, said that four ARRL HF/VHF Ham Aid kits in Guam are available for use in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), a US territory. Another seven kits are positioned in Hawaii. Corey said that radio amateurs in Guam and Hawaii are attempting to get in touch with hams who can assist on Saipan, part of the CNMI. Amateur Radio teams that had planned to operate in the CQ World Wide DX SSB Contest from Saipan this weekend have cancelled their trips.

"There is a small group of radio amateurs on Saipan who do VHF work," Corey said. "We are in process of reaching out to them, as well as to radio amateurs who go to Saipan and Tinian for the CQ WW DX SSB event."

While Guam is reporting no serious communication issues, public service communication on Saipan is offline. Several stations in Hawaii, including large contest stations, have HF capability to Guam and Saipan, and three stations have agreed to pass traffic to Guam/Saipan if needed, Corey said. These include the five-position contest station station of Lloyd Cabral, KH6LC, on Hawaii's Big Island; the station of Doug Morgan, KH6U, on Oahu, and the six-position contest stations of Kimo Chung, KH7U, and the Koolau Amateur Radio Club, KH6J, on Oahu.

According to information received by ARRL from the Amateur Radio community in Hawaii, Guam, and Saipan, one station was showing up on DMR, but that would likely be of little use if the internet is down. One PACTOR-4-equipped station is available on Guam, and Winlink (radio email) gateways exist in Hawaii.

"There are no transportation arrangements available to ARRL at this time to move Ham Aid kits from Hawaii to Guam," Corey said. "We don't intend to move them unless we have operators in Guam/Saipan to use them."

The Marianas Amateur Radio Club (AH2G) in Guam has **posted photos and updates** from Saipan on its website.

Monthly Meeting - October 5, 2018

President Duane, K8MDA, called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm.

<u>Financial report</u> – presented by Harry, N8XMI. Danny, W8DLB moved to accept report as read, second by Henry WD8Q. Motion carried.

<u>Minutes</u> – Jane, KB8YPW, read the minutes of the September 7, 2018 meeting. Danny, W8DLB, moved to accept minutes as read, second by Henry WD8Q. Motion carried.

<u>Health and Wellness</u> – Lee Farquharson, N8LFKs' wife passed away recently. Condolences were offered to Lee.

<u>Education</u> – Duane, K8MDA, announced that a tech class is scheduled for 4 consecutive Saturdays starting October 27^{th} from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm and will be held in the community room of the People's Community Center. Katie, KD8MGB volunteered to assist Duane with teaching the class. Duane will make arrangements for testing at the end of the classes.

PIO – No report

<u>Tech Committee</u> – Dave, N8DPW, reported that the 444.7 DMR repeater connection to the Brandmeister Master Server was moved from 3103 to 3102 as of todays' date. This was done due to latency issues that were occurring with the 3103 server. This will make all communications through the repeater better, as there shouldn't be as many missed calls now that we are on a newer and faster server.

<u>ARES</u> – Danny, W8DLB – reminded everyone to get their 4 core NIMS classes completed and certificates submitted to Scott, N8SY and himself (Danny) so information can be entered in the ARES Connect database. There will be a 'fox hunt', search and rescue exercise with the Sheriff department and the CERT team this weekend.

Shiloh has offered a room in the old school building for use as a HAM Station if the club is interested.

<u>ARRL</u> – Scott, N8SY – reported that the Ohio Section was initiating a program awarding the person with the most hours logged in ARES Connect. Details will be in the Ohio Section Newsletter and on the Ohio Section website.

The ARRL will have a new CEO effective October, 15, 2018.

<u>Old Business</u> – Danny, W8DLB - reported that he is waiting on cables and sound card for the IRLP. New Skywarn classes will focus on fall and winter weather. Several counties around Richland are scheduled for these winter classes. Ashland's classes are scheduled for October 23rd at the Ashland Sheriff's Office Annex Building and Huron County has a class scheduled for October 29th in Willard.

New Business -

Hamfest - Steve, N8SMB will take care of the printing and mailing. Danny, W8DLB, and Scott, N8SY will handle table and ticket sales. The hamfest has been registered with ARRL and has been approved by the Great Lakes Director and is listed in the ARRL and Ohio Section Hamfest websites.

Discussion was held regarding what to purchase and how much to spend on the door prizes for the hamfest. Danny, W8DLB, suggested raffling off a generator to bring in money to offset Hamfest/door prize costs. The door prize purchase was tabled until more information could be obtained on pricing. It was agreed that this would be addressed again at the November meeting when a final decision would need to be made.

Danny, W8DLB, moved to increase the price of Hamfest admission from \$5 to \$7. John, KD8WPE, seconded. Motion carried with 1 opposition.

Terry Carter of First Call 211 gave a presentation of services offered through First Call 211 and also announced that a HAM radio station will be set up at the First Call 211 building for use during emergencies. ARES and First Call 211 have an MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) regarding emergency communication services. First Call 211 employees will also be studying for HAM licenses.
